



# Word Study for --- OUCHES





**Exo 28:11 With the work of an engraver  
in stone, [like] the engravings of a  
signet, shalt thou engrave the two  
stones with the names of the children  
of Israel: thou shalt make them to be  
set in ouches of gold.**

**Exo 28:13 And thou shalt makeouches  
of gold;**

**Exo 28:14 And two chains [of] pure gold  
at the ends; [of] wreathen work shalt  
thou make them, and fasten the  
wreathen chains to the ouches.**

**Exo 28:25 And [the other] two ends of  
the two wreathen [chains] thou shalt  
fasten in the twoouches, and put [  
them] on the shoulder pieces of the  
ephod before it.**
