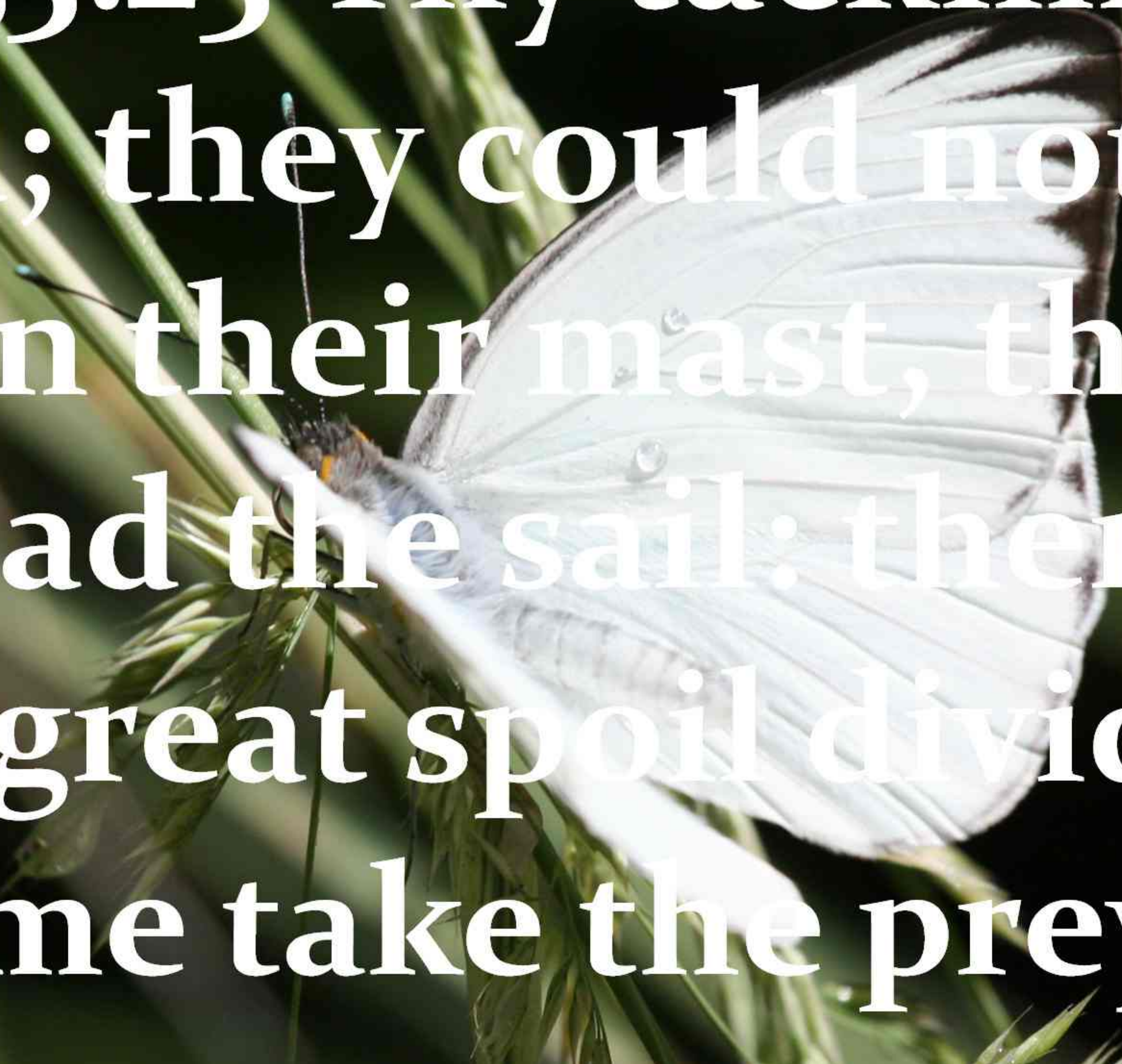
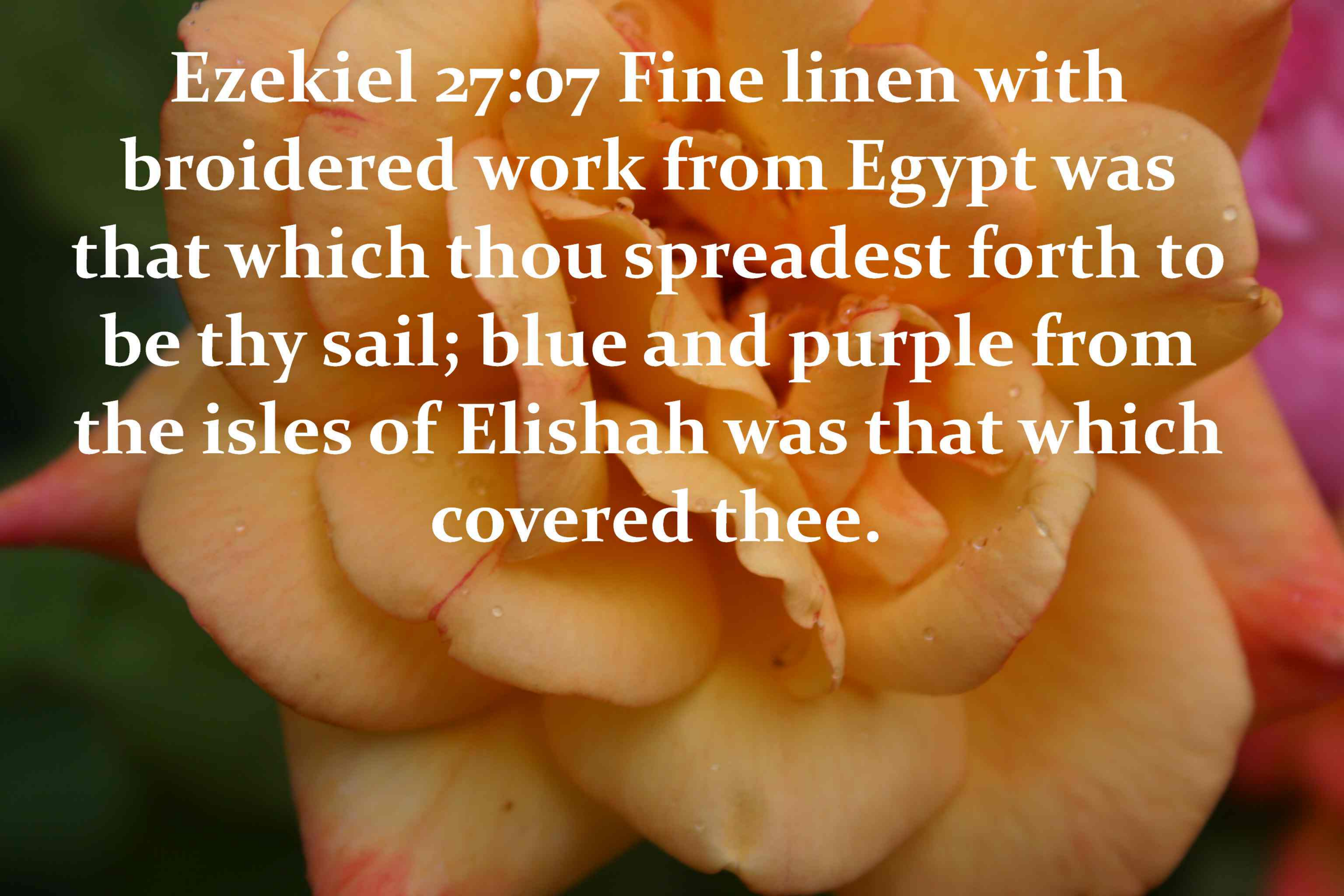

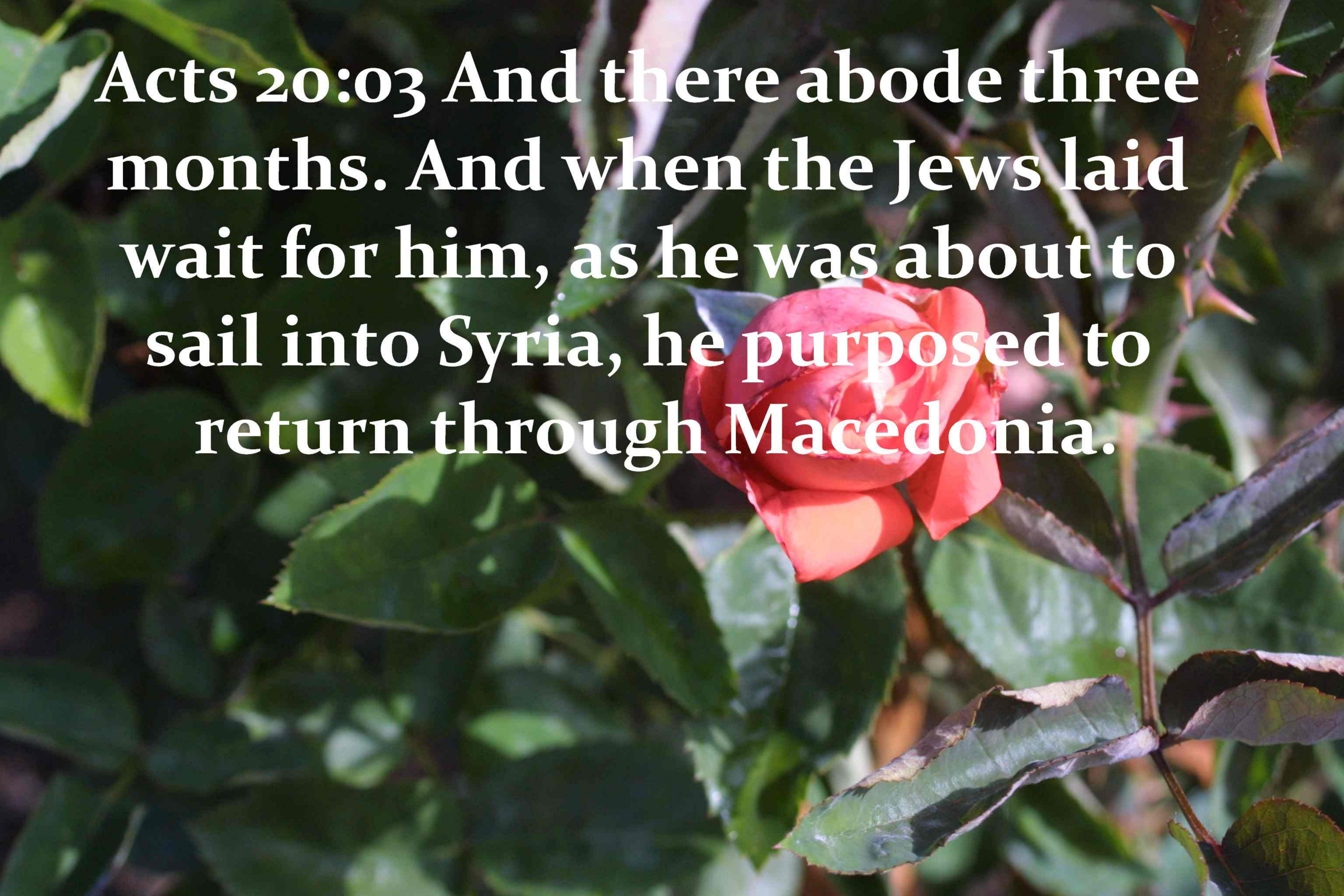
Isaiah 33:23 Thy tacklings are

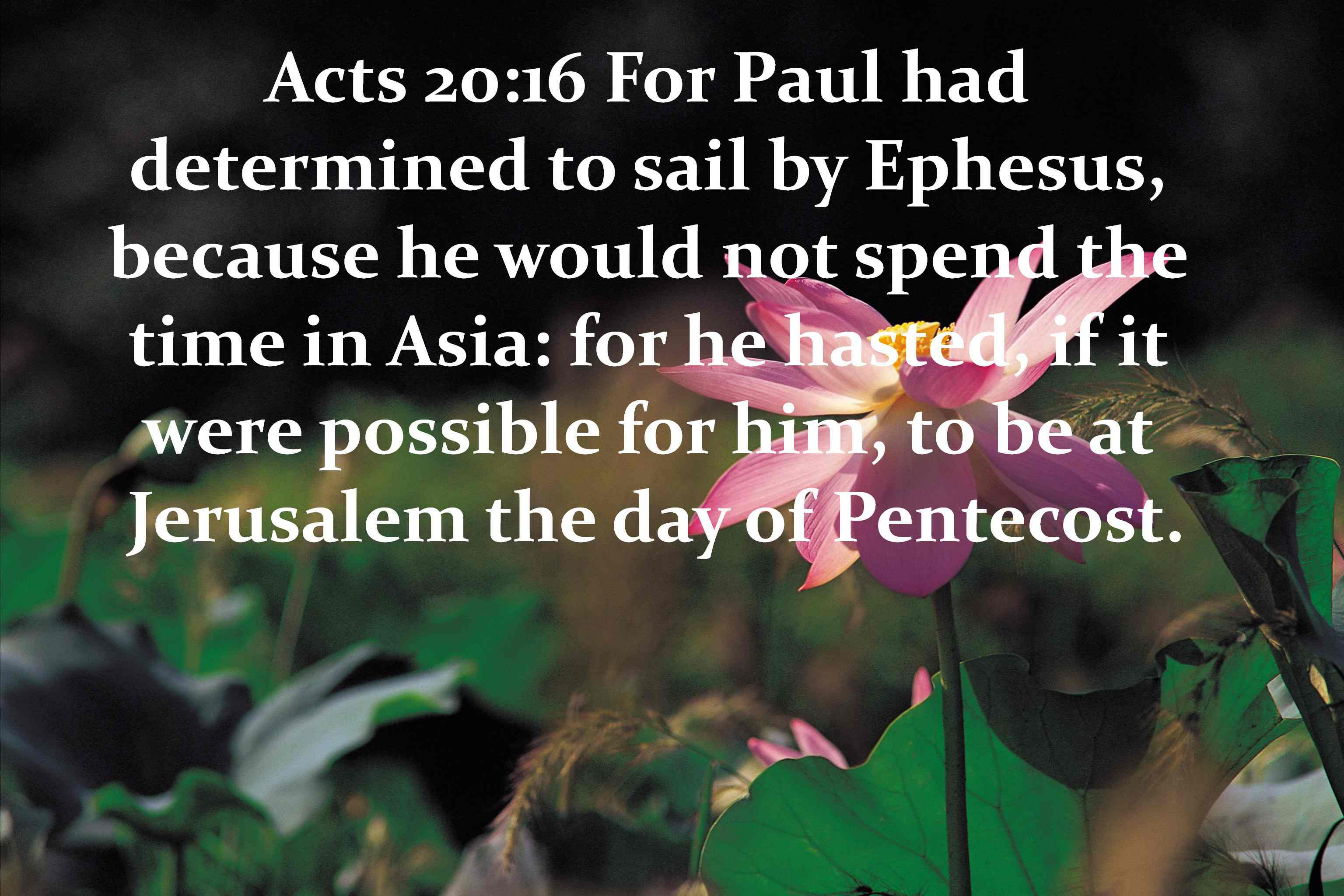

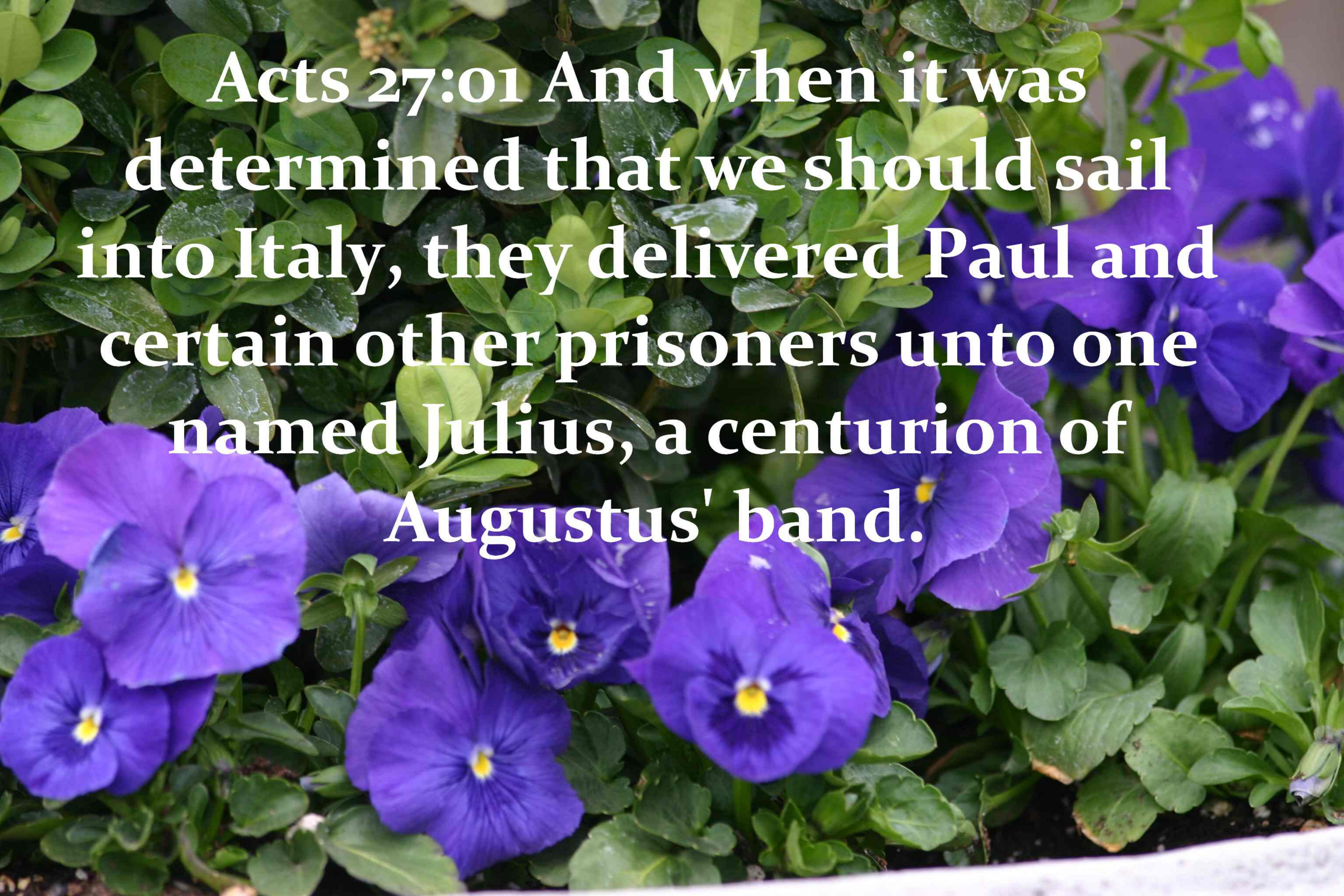

Acts 20:03 And there abode three months. And when the Jews laid wait for him, as he was about to sail into Syria, he purposed to return through Macedonia.

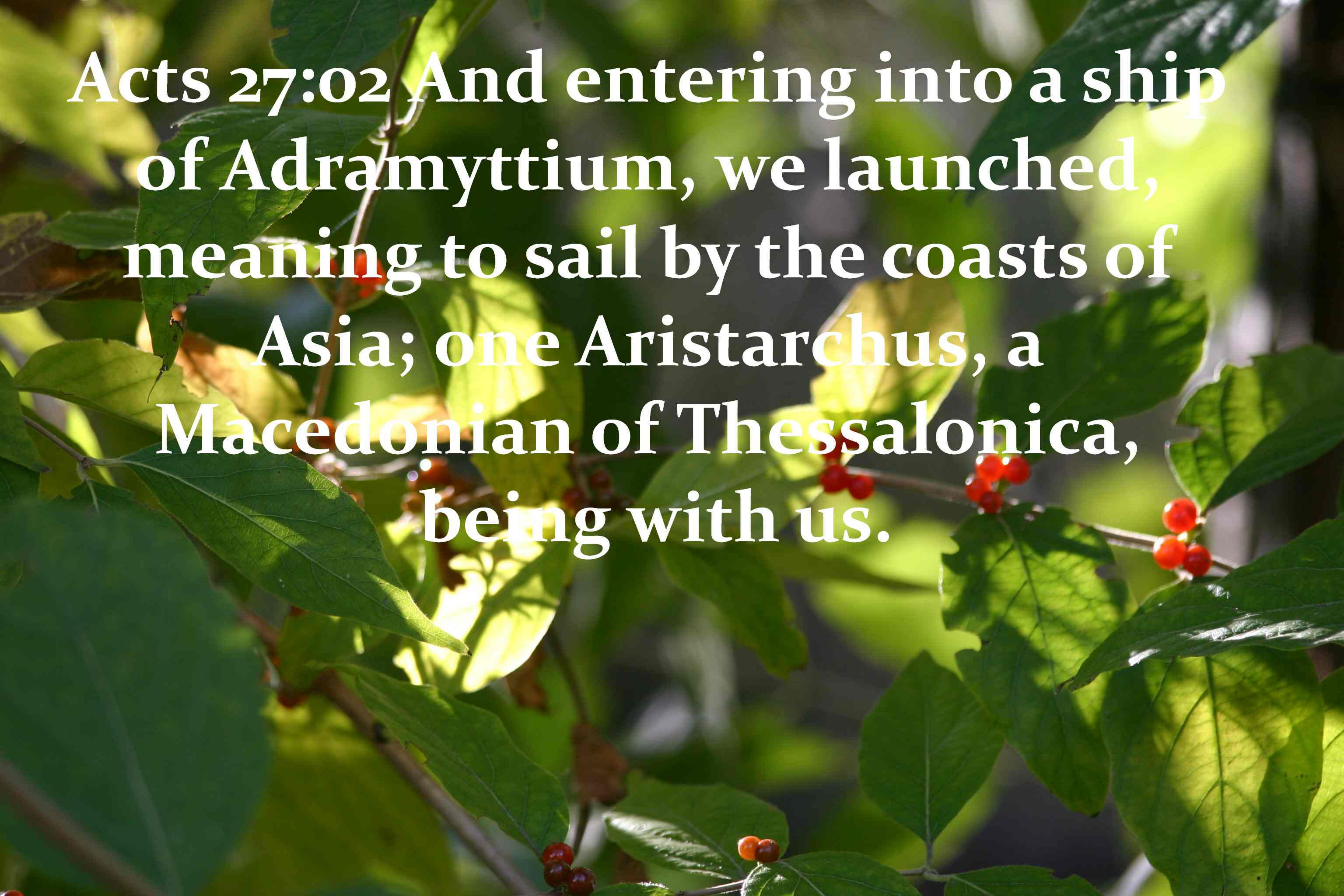

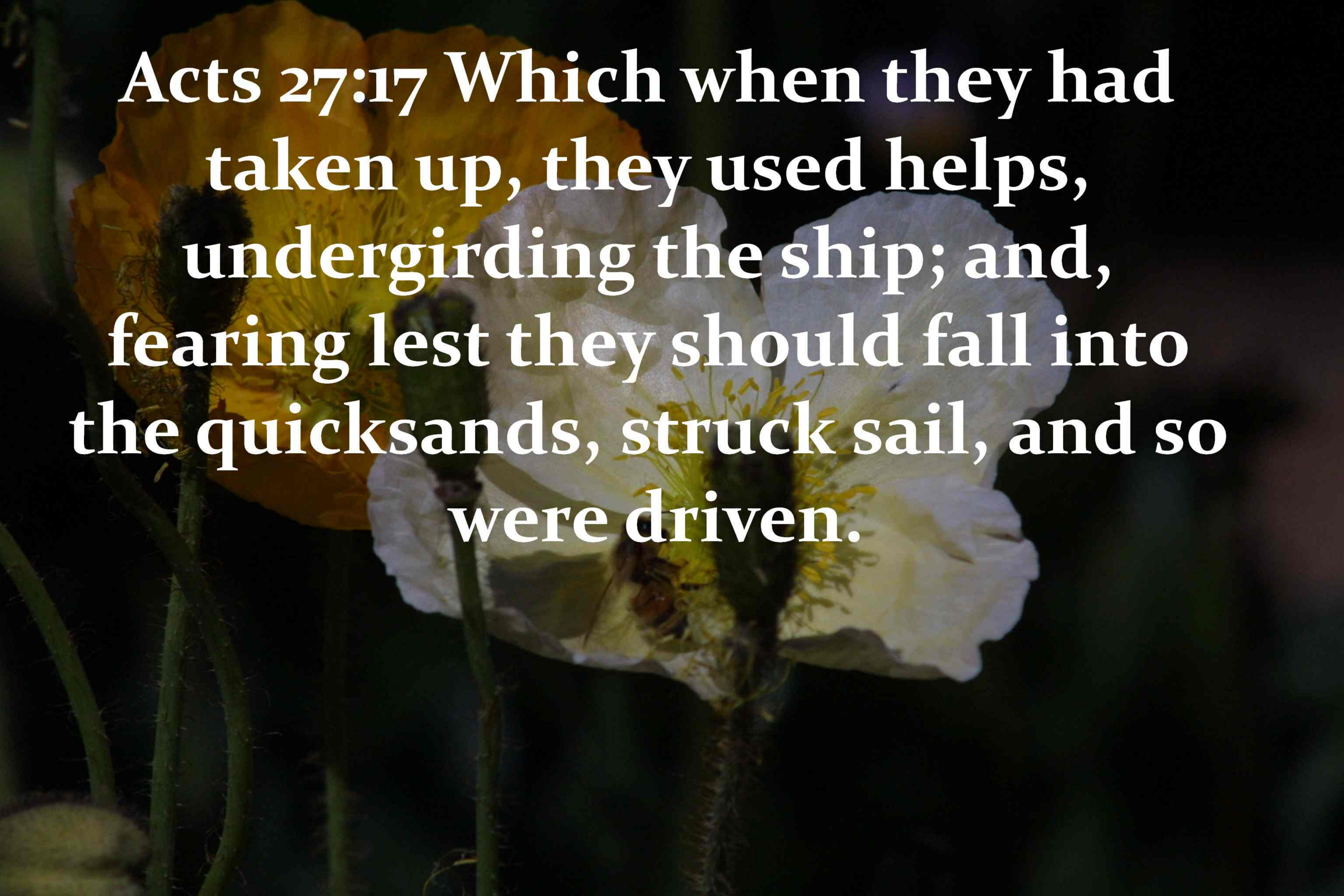

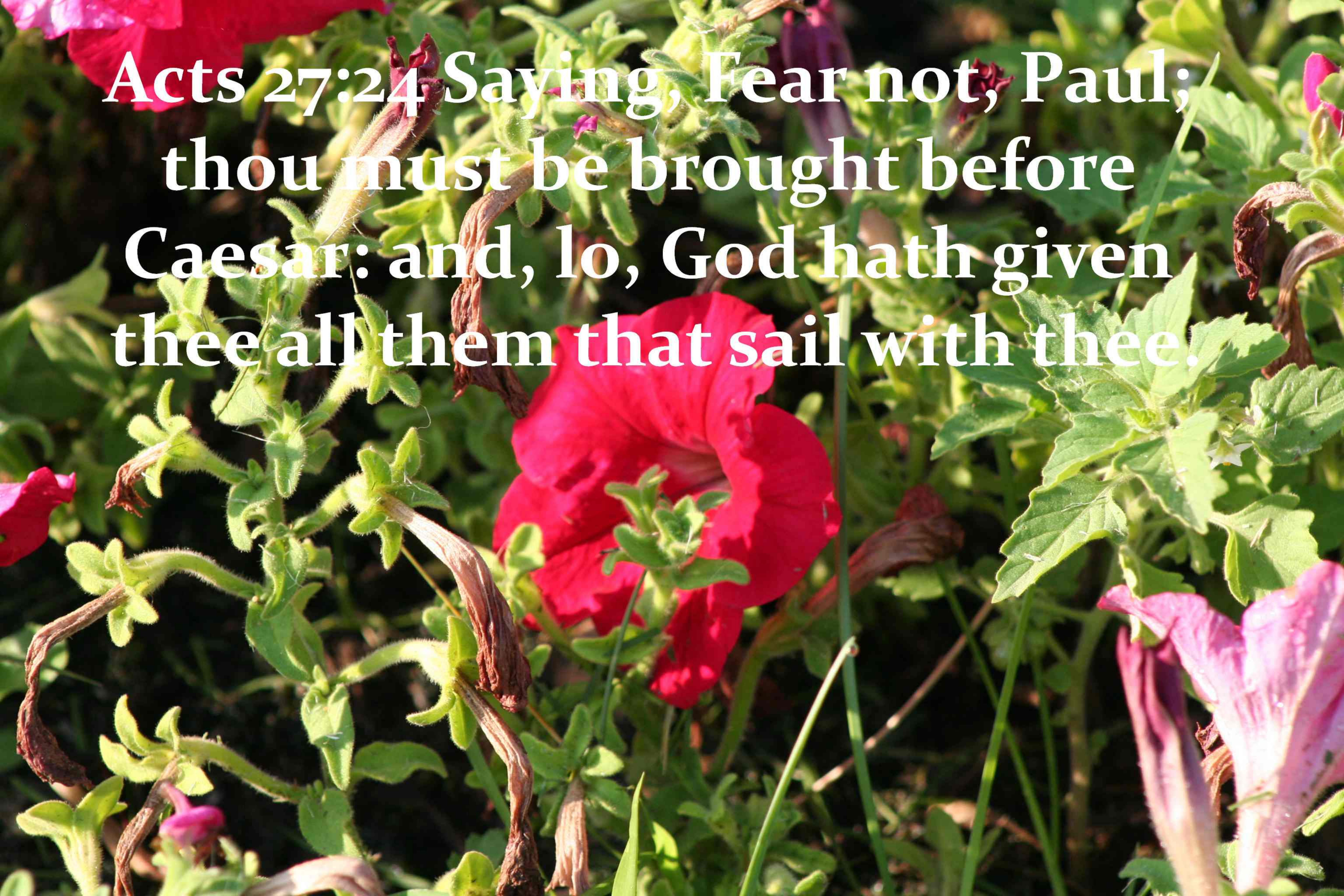
Acts 27:01 And when it was
