

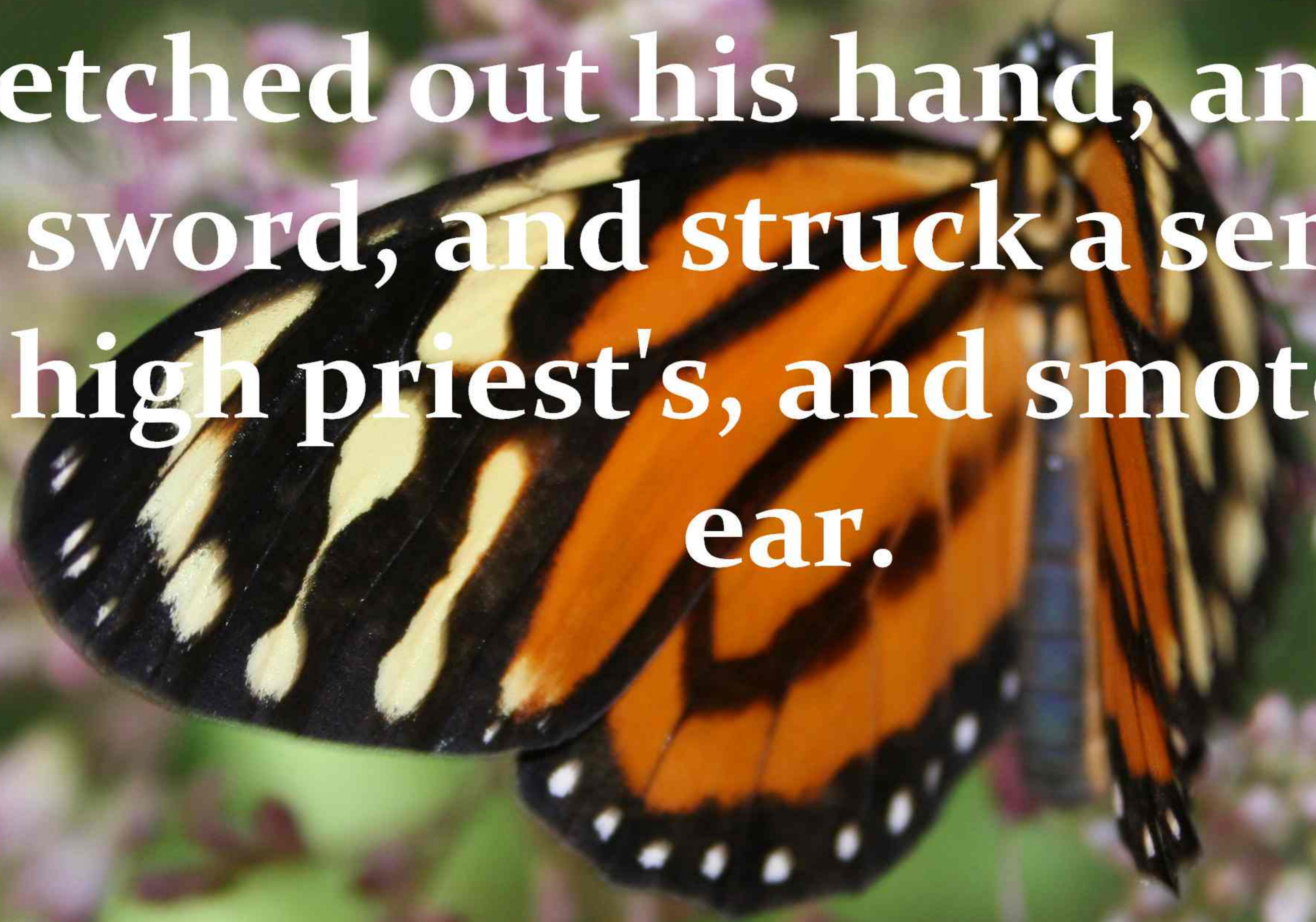


2nd Samuel 20:10 But Amasa took

son of Bichri.

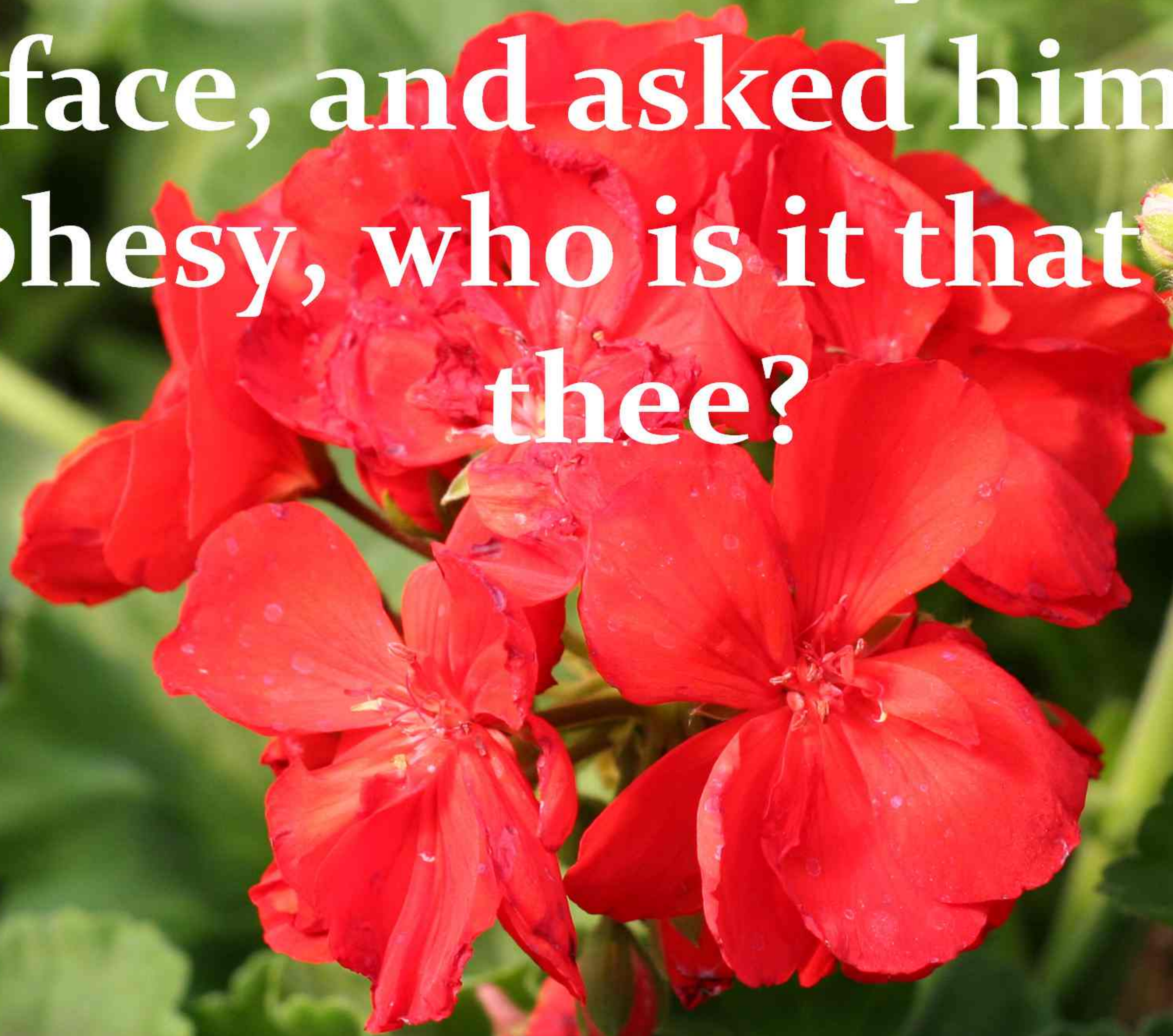
2nd Chronicles 13:20 Neither did




Luke 22:64 And when they had
